The weather is warming up but children still need a sensible coat and shoes. Children also NEED a school water bottle in school.




Thank you to all the children and parents who have been putting time and effort into the 'Grow a £1'. We have been hearing of some fantastic initiatives.

Thank you to all the 98 parents who completed the survey.

We are delighted with the results that clearly show that a huge majority of parents are supportive of the work done by our school. This makes all the staff extremely proud that parents can see the hard work and dedication that is put into school life.

100% of parents say their child is happy at our school and that they do well at this school.

100% of parents say our school gives their child the support they need to achieve.

As you can see, most parents believe that their child (or children) are happy, does well and is well supported by the school.

Only 3 parents gave negative responses to three questions and only 1 parent gave a negative response to four other questions. As always we would say that if you have any issues, please come and speak to us, your voice matters.

Some parents have answered 'don't know' to some of the questions and this was because they may not have had any experience of what was asked to give a positive answer e.g. 25% of parents don't know if the school deals quickly and effectively with bullying, many parents commented that they have had no experience of bullying so had to answer 'Don't know'.
